## **Guidance Notes**

## Part A- Critical Appraisal

Students are expected to select a single outcome measure relevant to their chosen theme. It is expected the students will address the following points:-

Justification for the chosen outcome measure (why) you choose it?

Validity and reliability of the outcome measure in a selected population

Issues relating to the clinical application of the outcome measure

Critical appraisal of research papers evaluating the outcome measure in selected patient populations (addressing is it for child, women or men?

Recommendations regarding the use of the outcome measure in clinical practice which cases are This section should be approximately 2000 words.

Strength & weakness points & Limitations and why we use it? are not . Part B- Critical Reflection

Students should present a reflective summary of how the information obtained within the literature review will impact on their future practice.

- This reflection should consider the use of the outcome measure in practice.
- The reflection should:
  - a) Demonstrate evidence of critical reflection and analysis of your practice pre the literature review and identify clearly why how your practice will change as a result of this new learning.
  - Demonstrate how you will apply the learning gained from this critical analysis to your future practice
- This coursework is not a descriptive account. It should provide only a brief description of what you have learned and the contextual background as a basis for critical analysis
